

## Syphilis in Arizona: AHCCCS testing coverage update

Given the <u>extremely high rates of syphilis and congenital syphilis</u> in Arizona, the AHCCCS Medical Policy Manual (AMPM) has been updated to reflect the importance of universal syphilis screening:

## **Effective October 2024:**

- Health care providers shall ensure that members are tested for syphilis at least annually, beginning at age 15 years old.
- The Contractor shall: Develop and implement a process for monitoring, evaluating, and improving provider compliance to ensure that members are tested for syphilis at least annually, beginning at age 15 years old.



**Testing is age based, not risk based.** All members 15 years and older should be tested *at least* annually.

New updates are contained within AMPM <u>411</u>, <u>420</u>, and <u>430</u>. **Updated Policies are effective October 1, 2024.** 

## Key points regarding updated policies:

- There is no upper age limit
- Policy applies regardless of gender
- No county epidemiology rates or sexual risk factors are needed to determine if there should be testing
- Members have the ability to opt-out of testing (like any other testing)
- There are no changes to existing billing codes or reimbursement rates
- This screening is outside of existing pregnancy screening requirements, as outlined in AMPM 410
