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Rheumatology Referrals

This is an advisory notification to Molina Healthcare of California (MHC) network providers applicable to the Medi-Cal line of business.

What you need to know:

Dear Providers of Pediatric Care,

Rady Children's Hospital has asked us to share the following important information regarding Pediatric Rheumatology referrals:

Rady is seeing a significant increase in referrals to Pediatric Rheumatology from community clinics, many of which are not consistent with the clinical guidelines for rheumatologic evaluation.

We'd like to share important reminders and updates to ensure timely and appropriate access to care for all patients and to improve coordination between referring providers and the Rheumatology Division at Rady Children's Hospital.

Key Issues Observed:

- Many referrals lack clinical history suggestive of rheumatologic disease.
- Necessary laboratory testing and imaging workup are often not completed prior to referral.
- Referrals are frequently based on nonspecific or inappropriate labs, such as positive ANA results.
 - It is important to note that up to 20% of healthy children and adolescents may test "high" for ANA, which is not indicative of rheumatologic disease on its own.
- A family history of rheumatologic conditions is not a referral indication without supportive clinical symptoms and findings.
- Authorization requests are being submitted after appointments are already scheduled, limiting our ability to triage or redirect patients to more appropriate services in a timely manner.

Provider Action

- Ensure that your clinic teams are trained on the rheumatology referral and authorization process.
- Use the appropriate referral forms and submit prior authorization requests at the time of referral.
- Consider alternative pathways (e.g., PT, pain clinic) when evaluation does not support a rheumatologic diagnosis.

What you need to know CONT:

Referral & Authorization Requirements:

All referrals to Pediatric Rheumatology require prior authorization and must be submitted at the time the referral is placed. This enables timely review, potential redirection to appropriate care, and helps avoid treatment delays.

For joint pain referrals, please refer to the following to help support medical necessity:

- Clinical characteristics suggestive of rheumatologic disease:
 - o Chronic, persistent joint pain accompanied by swelling and not explained by trauma.
- Recommended workup prior to referral:
 - o CBC with differential
 - o CRP and ESR
 - o Comprehensive metabolic panel
 - o Urinalysis
 - o Plain radiographs of affected joints

Without clinical or laboratory evidence of inflammatory disease, a diagnosis of rheumatologic disease is unlikely. In these cases, referrals may delay access to more appropriate care, such as physical therapy, pain management, or other specialty services.
