WISe Training: Trauma and Resilience in People with Disabilities (Sept. 24 and 26)

What is it? This interactive training will explore the ways a mental health crisis may look differently in those who have intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. Attendees will be able to gain effective strategies to better support people with disabilities.

Who should attend? Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe) supervisors, therapists, family and youth partners, and care coordinators who want to expand their skill set in working with WISe clients with autism and/or intellectual disabilities who have experienced trauma.

No-Cost Community-Based Integrated Care Fellowship – Apply for Mar. 2020 Cohort

What is it? This no-cost, year-long program for psychiatric providers is CME-accredited and presented by the Integrated Care Training Program in the University of Washington's Dept. of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. Participants will receive additional training in delivering integrated care in community-based settings.

Who should apply? Psychiatric providers including psychiatrists, psychiatric ARNPs, and psychiatric PAs

When & where: The year-long program begins in March 2020 and includes a weekly 4-hour commitment to the distance learning portion and 4 quarterly 2-day, in-person sessions, to be held in Seattle.

Behavioral Health (BH) Facilities Grant Program – Applications Now Accepted

What is it? Presented by the Department of Commerce, this is a reimbursement-style grant open to community entities around the state seeking to expand their capacity for BH services. The grant is for capital construction projects only. Funds may be used for design, engineering, construction and equipment costs associated with establishing these facilities.

Who should attend? Non-profits, public entities, tribes and for-profit businesses are invited to apply. Parties must be registered in the State of Washington and licensed to provide BH services.
